The middle of the work day works well for Tracy to be a mentor for Everybody Wins! Vermont. It's easy to work around, and she has support from co-workers to be gone for that hour or so to read to her mentee, Jude. Her employer Marathon Health really encourages employees to volunteer in the community. As an added benefit,

Tracy gets a bit of a mid-day break—out of the office, meeting new people, viewing new scenery. She returns to work refreshed and rewarded.

Sustainability Academy is where Tracy reads to her second grade mentee, Jude. The school is great—small, cute, compact. "I like that little school. You can see that the kids are cared for." School lunches are so much better than when she was at school!

Each week Tracy meets with Jude to read Jude's favorite books. "My mentee is smart, smart as a whip! Smarter than I thought a 2nd grader would be." Tracy looks forward to her time with Jude and vice versa.

About his time with Tracy, Jude says, "I love reading with Tracy. We read about superheroes and I told her that I want to be Iron Man when I grow up. She likes superheroes too."

Marathon Health asked employees to write a short piece about what they were doing to give back to the community. Tracy's piece won the contest, resulting in a \$250 donation to Everybody Wins!
