SURVEY RESPONSE RATES



Teachers	68%	N/A	67%

Mentees	84%	20% Insufficient # of responses	100%
Mentors	84%	80%	100%

- ✓ The program helped children read better according to:
 - **60%** of parents

- ✓ **70%** of parents said their children showed improved (or greatly improved) vocabulary


- ✓ **80%** of mentees said that they read more often because of reading with their mentor

- ✓ Mentees now have a greater enthusiasm for reading, according to **90%** of parents and **57%** of mentors

- ✓ Mentees now read more often by choice, according to **50%** of parents

- ✓ Mentees now are better able to talk about books and ideas, according to:
 - **40%** of parents
 - **64%** of mentors

- ✓ Parents said that **40%** of students participating in Everybody Wins! have shown improved grades/classroom performance
- ✓ Mentees now have a greater enthusiasm for school, according to **50%** of parents

OTHER BENEFITS FROM MENTORING Sustainability Academy 2021 - 2022

- ✓ Parents said that **60%** of students participating in the Everybody Wins! program feel that more adults care about them

- ✓ **100%** of mentees said that they have a strong, positive relationship with their mentor

- ✓ Improvement (or great improvement) in mentees' overall self-confidence was reported by
 - **50%** of parents
 - **67%** of mentors

- ✓ **73%** of mentees said that their mentor made a positive difference in their life

- ✓ **93%** of mentees said that their mentor was dependable

- ✓ **93%** of mentors said that Everybody Wins! met or surpassed expectations

- ✓ **93%** mentors said that Everybody Wins! was well organized

- ✓ **100%** of mentors said that they felt supported by the Everybody Wins! site coordinator

- ✓ Repeat participation:
 - **100%** of mentors would recommend the program to family & friends
 - **100%** of teachers would like their students to participate in Everybody Wins! again next year

- ✓ **100%** of mentors said that having a mentee has made a positive difference in their life
- ✓ **85%** of mentors said that they have a strong positive relationship with their mentee
